



PAINTING GUIDE

DUNGEON WALLS AND FLOORS



STEP 1



EARTH STONE
(GT002-ES)

Most dungeon pieces (pieces with bricks on the sides) follow these steps.

The first step is painting your accent bricks. Using **Earth Stone** and a Pokorny Paintbrush #3, add paint to your brush then dab off the excess. If the paint is applied too heavily, you'll lose the texture of the brick.

Randomly select the bricks you would like to paint, clustering some of your accent bricks, but keeping most of them scattered.

Let this step dry.

STEP 2



DEEP LAVA
(GT002-DL)

and

BLACK
(GT002-B)

If your dungeon wall has pillars, use **Deep Lava** to fill in the stems of the pillars. You may need two coats of paint to fully coat the pillars.

Then use **Black** to paint the tops and bottoms of your pillars as well as the arch connecting them.

Let your pillars and arches dry before beginning step 3.



STEP 3



CAVERN STONE
DRY BRUSH
(GT002-CD)

or

CAVERN STONE
DRY BRUSH
(GT002-CD)

+

SCHOOL BUS
(GT002-SB)

For all Dwarven Forge pieces, the last step is the dry brush. Dry brushing brings out the textural detail and hand-sculpted beauty of each piece.

If you'd like to use one color, Cavern Stone Dry Brush will work well. If you'd like your piece to look closer to the factory paint, mix Cavern Stone Dry Brush with School Bus in a 3:1 ratio.

Dip a large puffy brush in your paint, then dry off your brush against a paper towel. This will remove most of the paint and leave you with a light dusting that makes the sculptural texture pop.

If your piece has them, the pillars and arches should get a lighter dry brush application.
